The Board fulfills its mission through the regulation of the practice of nursing and the approval of nursing education programs. This mission, derived from the Nursing Practice Act, supersedes the interest of any individual, the nursing profession, or any special interest group.



Texas Board of Nursing Recognized with 2010 NCSBN Regulatory Achievement Award

The Texas Board of Nursing (BON) was recognized by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) at its annual awards ceremony held on Thursday, August 12, 2010. This ceremony was part of the NCSBN Annual Meeting and Delegate Assembly held in Portland, Oregon, August 11-13, 2010. BON was awarded the 2010 Regulatory Achievement Award that recognizes the member board that has made an identifiable, significant contribution to the purpose of NCSBN in promoting public policy related to the safe and effective practice of nursing in the interest of public welfare.

The NCSBN, in examining the BON's contributions, took into consideration the following: The BON implementation of criminal background checks on candidates for licensure by endorsement, examination, or renewal; completion of a pilot program of criminal background checks on students when first entering or considering entry into nursing educational programs; patient safety initiatives including formation of the Healthcare Alliance Safety Partnership (HASP) in conjunction with three hospital systems which developed a voluntary, non-punitive system for reporting, investigating, and analyzing nursing errors; promotion of patient safety initiatives through an

ongoing section of the *Board of Nursing Bulletin* titled "Nurses on Guard" which includes articles written by staff, readers, and guest writers sharing information focused

on increasing patient safety; and active multi-departmental participation in the NCSBN's Taxonomy of Error, Root Cause Analysis and Practice-Responsibility (TERCAP) initiative, providing more case study data than any other state participating in the program.

Other BON actions considered for the award were: implementation of paperless licensure, with most licensure processes now available online; advancement of the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC), including staff visits with other states considering passage of the NLC as well

as agency adoption of rules necessary to implement the advanced practice registered nurse compact by December 31, 2011; advancement of innovations in nursing

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Katherine Thomas Recognized for Fifteen Years of Service to NCSBN

Katherine Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director of the Texas Board of Nursing (BON), was honored by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) for fifteen years of service on behalf of NCSBN at their Annual Meeting and Delegate Assembly held in Portland, Oregon, August 11-13, 2010. Ms. Thomas currently serves as Director at Large for the NCSBN, following reelection to the two-year post at this year's delegate assembly meeting.

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Summary of Actions

A regular meeting of the Board of Nursing was held July 22-23, 2010, in Austin. The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.



In the August 13, 2010, issue of the Texas Register, the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) proposed amendments to §216.1, relating to *Definitions*, and §216.3, relating to *Requirements*. These proposed amendments are authorized under the Occupations Code §301.303 and §301.151 and are necessary to advance the Board's comprehensive approach to continuing competency in nursing.

Amendments to §216.1 and §216.3 require a nurse who chooses to complete continuing education courses to complete courses in his or her area of practice. While the Board recognizes that there is some benefit in continuing education courses that apply generally to all nursing practice, the Board has determined that there is more benefit in continuing education courses that apply to a nurse's specific area of practice. This is because a nurse is able to provide a better quality of care in the area of practice in which he or she is most knowledgeable. A nurse who enhances his or her expertise through practice specific continuing education courses is more likely to provide his or her patients with better care than a nurse who has not received the same specific training.

Proposed amended §216.1(4) defines "area of practice" as any activity, assignment, or task in which the nurse utilized nursing knowledge, judgment,

or skills during the licensure renewal cycle. Further, proposed amended §216.1(4) provides that, if a nurse does not have a current area of practice, the nurse may refer to his or her last area of practice or most recent area of practice.

Proposed amended §216.3(a) provides that a nurse must meet either the requirements of §216.3(a) or (b). Further, proposed amended §216.3(a) provides that a nurse may choose to complete 20 contact hours of continuing education within the two years immediately preceding renewal of registration in his or her area of practice.

Additionally, these hours shall be obtained by participation in programs approved by a credentialing agency recognized by the Board. Further, proposed amended §216.3(a) provides that a list of these agencies/organizations may be obtained from the Board's office or web site. No comments were received and the rules were adopted in the October 1, 2010, edition of the *Texas Register* effective October 4, 2010.

In the August 20, 2010, issue of the Texas Register, the BON proposed amendments to §217.6, relating to *Failure to Renew License*, and §217.9, relating to *Inactive Status*. The proposed amendments are necessary to: (i) clarify the existing requirements that apply to the reactivation of an expired (delinquent) or inactive nursing license;

(ii) specify the new requirements that will apply to the reactivation of an expired (delinquent) or inactive nursing license; (iii) provide additional guidance regarding the content requirements of a refresher course, extensive orientation to the practice of nursing, and nursing program of study (refresher course/s); (iv) ensure consistency among the requirements of §217.6 and §217.9; and (v) prevent individuals with serious and potentially disqualifying histories from renewing delinquent licenses until the Board has had a full opportunity to investigate and take appropriate action. No comments were received and the rules were adopted in the October 8, 2010, edition of the Texas Register effective October 11, 2010.

Nurses On Guard - Best Practice in Patient Safety

One Emergency Department's Patient Throughput

The Texas Board of Nursing is interested in hearing from nurses on how they implement best practices. This is another snapshot of the important work that nurses are doing throughout Texas as they guard their patients against harmful errors and strive to deliver high quality care in their nursing practice.

Patients present to the Emergency Department (ED) hoping to receive expedient care for their emergent condition. When they spend prolonged amounts of time waiting to be registered and subsequently triaged, the healthcare system can actually delay their treatment and potentially put their safety at risk in the waiting room.

Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital in Plano, Texas has implemented a process that allows for a rapid triage and bedside registration process. This allows patients to be brought back into the ED much more quickly where they can receive the care they need from clinical staff. The radiology and lab team members interrupt nursing staff in patient rooms if needed to expedite critical testing and results

Team-based care defined by zones in the ED increases communication among staff members, physicians, and most importantly, patients. As a result, the *patient satisfaction scores* in the ED improved to above the 90th percentile when compared to the Press Ganey Large Database and the *left without being seen* rate averages at or below 0.5%.

Communication regarding delays is a vital component in patient satisfaction scores (Potera, 2009), and when

patients are receiving care, delays can be more closely monitored by the primary nurse. In addition, Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital opened the back door of their ED by tracking and trending the *discharge order times* of their physicians with the *highest in-patient volume* to increase internal capacity.

In-patient nursing staff are responsible to ensure that discharge planning is initiated early in the hospitalization and the patient is discharged in a timely manner when clinical criteria are met. These key components are the framework which has allowed the ED to stop routinely holding patients in the ED and improve the overall experience throughout the healthcare facility.

Nurses are an integral link when it comes to keeping patients moving through the ED and they highly influence patient satisfaction by offering human interaction. Potera (2009) reported that "comfortable waiting rooms also improve patient satisfaction and, based on patient comments, so does the presence of nurses" (p. 22). Nurses who are on guard every day can improve the safety of their patients.

Imposter Warnings: Who is an Imposter?

When nurses receive their quarterly *Texas Board of Nursing Bulletin*, many nurses turn immediately to the Imposter Warning page. It is dismaying to see individuals who have attempted to work as nurses when they are not licensed to practice. Imposters are unlicensed individuals who refer to themselves as nurses and have attempted to work as nurses. The Texas Nursing Practice Act (NPA) requires that a person have a current Texas license or a nursing license from a compact state, in order to practice nursing in Texas. Individuals who represent themselves as nurses and are not properly licensed are doing so illegally. The public and the nursing profession are concerned for patient safety when this happens because a license signifies that an individual is competent to practice safely.

The title "nurse" is entrusted to those individuals who have been duly authorized by the Texas Board of Nursing (BON). To practice nursing is a privilege, and individuals must be licensed before providing nursing care. The titles designated by the BON that nurses may use, depending on their level of education, are "Registered Nurse," "Licensed Vocational Nurse," or "Vocational Nurse." These may be abbreviated as "RN," or "LVN." When authorized by the BON, advanced practice registered nurses have the additional responsibility of using their advanced practice titles.

Imposters, non-licensed individuals who call themselves nurses and are practicing nursing, are a danger to society and potentially could cause harm to patients. Board staff recommends reporting these individuals immediately to the BON and local law enforcement. Information about *How to File a Complaint* is available on the Board's website under *Disciplinary Action*. The BON receives imposter complaints from various sources. Imposters may be discovered when they apply for jobs. Other imposters may actually be working as nurses without

licenses. The BON does not receive a large number of these types of complaints; however, holding oneself out as a nurse when not licensed as a nurse is serious and unlawful. When the BON receives complaints of this nature, a case file is opened and an investigation begins.

There is another category of individuals who refer to themselves as nurses, but are not employed in nursing settings. For example, some veterinary assistants use the term "vet nurse" to describe themselves. These persons are of concern to the Board because they are misrepresenting themselves as licensed nurses to the public. This type of behavior is also unlawful and should be reported to the BON. Once again, when the BON receives complaints of this nature, a case file is opened and an investigation begins. These individuals are notified immediately to stop representing themselves as nurses.

Nurse administrators and employers of nurses have an important responsibility to verify the current licensure status of their nursing staff. In addition, a nurse administrator should determine whether an individual seeking employment has a current license or any disciplinary action. Nurse administrators have been disciplined in the past for employing imposters or failing to verify current licensure status of their nursing staff. By using the licensure verification information available throught the BON web site, or contacting Board staff by e-mail or phone, the protection of the public can be ensured by verifying that nurses are properly licensed.

Friendly reminder.....

Forensic CEUs – As a reminder, Nursing Practice Act §301.306 and Board Rule 216.3(d) requires all nurses licensed in Texas who are "*employed to work in an emergency room (ER) setting*" to complete a minimum of 2 hours of continuing education relating to forensic evidence collection. This applies to nurses whose home unit is an ER, who 'float' to an ER, or are contractual, temporary, per diem, agency, traveling, or who have other employment situations where duties include working in an ER.



Continuing Competency Requirements Now Focus on Area of Practice

One method of promoting patient safety is through the continuing competency of healthcare practitioners. Healthcare is ever changing and nursing practice changes in response to and in anticipation of those changes. Acquisition of knowledge specific to a nurse's area of practice is a method the nurse may use to demonstrate continued competency and enhance professional growth.

Traditionally, nurses have demonstrated continuing competency through completion of continuing education or the completion of certain academic courses. One new way to demonstrate continuing competency in Texas is through the achievement, maintenance, or renewal of an approved national nursing certification in the nurse's area of practice.

A national nursing certification must be issued by a certifying body accredited by a national certification accreditation agency recognized by the Board to count as continuing competency for licensure renewal. A national nursing certification that has been approved by the Accreditation Board for Specialty Nursing Certification (ABSNC) that is attained, maintained, or renewed during the licensure renewal cycle, and is in the nurse's area of practice, will be accepted to demonstrate the nurse's continued competency. The National Association for Practical Nurse Education & Service, Inc. (NAPNES) offers certifications for LVNs that are approved for demonstration of continuing competency. In general, the requirements to attain an approved national nursing certification include practice hours in the area of specialty as well as completion of continuing education courses in the specialty practice area.

Significant emphasis was placed on ensuring that the definition of the nurse's "area of practice" is broad and inclusive of all nurses. The adopted definition of "area of practice" is: "any activity, assignment, or task in which the nurse utilized nursing knowledge, judgment, or skills during the licensure renewal cycle. If a nurse does not have a current area of practice, the nurse may refer to his or her last area of practice or most recent area of practice" [Board Rule 216.1(4)].

In determining your area of nursing practice, consideration should be given to requirements of the assignment(s). If a nursing license is required to accept the assignment, you are practicing nursing. Traditional nursing assignments, such as direct patient care, nursing administration, and nursing education, provide various options for continuing education focus areas. For example, a nurse manager for a pediatric unit could complete continuing education in nursing administration or areas related to pediatric nursing. The newer specialties and subspecialties in nursing may have fewer opportunities for continuing education. Nursing informatics, a fairly new speciality, may have fewer opportunities for continuing education. However, application of informatics in nursing can impact care delivery, nursing documentation, and may simplify the nursing process. Informatics may also be used in relation to medication orders and administration, to facilitate data collection for nurse researchers, or for quality improvement. Any of these topics may be appropriate for nurses working in the area of informatics. Some types of continuing education apply to any nurse, such as ethics, confidentiality, documentation, and nursing law and rules.

With the change to the continuing competency rule, nurses are required to have an approved national nursing certification *or* complete 20 hours of continuing education in their area of practice. Requiring continuing competency activities to be in the nurse's practice area is consistent with the Board's mission to protect and promote patient safety and welfare. The interpretation of the area of practice definition is broad to assist nurses with compliance. Nurses may choose to attain continuing education in excess of the minimum 20 contact hours that are required. Advisory Committee Update

ACE and NPAC Meet Jointly

The Advisory Committee on Education (ACE) and the Nursing Practice Advisory Committee (NPAC) met on May 17, 2010 to address two joint charges. In 2009, the Board issued charges for the committees to study and develop rules related to failure to renew a license after a significant passage of time (Rule 217.6, Failure to Renew a License and Rule 217.9, Inactive Status); and the demonstration of continuing competency through continuing education in a nurse's area of practice, including the effect on non-traditional nursing occupations (Rule 216.1, Pertaining to Fees and Rule 216.3, Pertaining to Requirements). The committees made recommendations to the Board during the July 22, 2010 meeting. The recommendations were approved and submitted to the Texas Register for a public comment period. The adopted rules are available on the Board's website, under **Nursing Law and Rules**, then **Adopted Rules**.

APNAC Discusses Education and Licensing

The Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee (APNAC) met on August 30, 2010 in Austin. APNAC members discussed issues related to APRN education. The committee will continue this discussion at its next meeting. Committee members also discussed issues related to APRN licensure and issues related to implementation. The committee will meet again on October 4, 2010.

education including workshops for nursing deans and directors that included presentations related to effective strategies and innovations in nursing education; implementation of rules and processes which delineate the flexibility of clinical faculty ratios allowing one faculty to work with up to twenty-four students; allowance of all qualified registered nurses to function as clinical teaching assistants, resulting in a larger pool of faculty extenders available for employment by nursing educational programs; elimination of faculty-tostudent ratios in all clinical learning experiences except those involving direct patient care; allowance of career school/ college new professional nursing educational program proposal submission while awaiting regional accreditation; granting approval for nursing programs outside of Texas's jurisdiction to conduct clinical learning experiences in Texas; and agency development and administration of a jurisprudence examination that all Texas candidates for nurse licensure by examination or endorsement must pass in order to obtain nurse licensure.

The Texas BON, through participation of Board members and staff, has had a long history of contributing to the advancement and improvement of regulation of the profession of nursing through promotion of the initiatives of the NCSBN.
